Meet the Composers

BraveSouls & Dreamers was commissioned by the Portland Gay Men's Chorus in 2007 and composed by Robert Seeley with text by his partner, Robert Espindola "in response to current raging wars." In creating the text for this ten-movement composition, Espindola was inspired by the words of Gandhi, Jesus, Mother Teresa, Isaiah, Jimmy Carter, Confucius, Buddha, and the Qur'an. In September 2011, the Portland Gay Men's Chorus performed *BraveSouls & Dreamers* at St. John the Divine in New York City as part of the 10th anniversary commemoration of 9/11.

After hearing the men's chorus *BraveSouls & Dreamers* in concert, One Voice Artistic Director, Jane Ramseyer Miller, asked Robert Seeley if he would consider creating an arrangement for SATB (mixed) chorus to premiere here in the Twin Cities. This powerful 43-minute multi-movement piece is scored for chorus, instrumental ensemble, and four soloists including voices of the Mother, Sage and two Soldiers.

One Voice's arrangement of *BraveSouls & Dreamers* was made possible through a generous donation by Vicki Janisch-Tri and Jerry Tri in loving memory of Cynthia Schmidt.



Composer Robert Seeley,

a California native, was raised in a small town in the Mojave Desert. He received his formal education at California State University, Chico, where he received a B.A. in music theory and composition. He is a former Composer in Residence for the

San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus for which he composed NakedMan in 1996. He has also written for the Twin Cities Gay Men's Chorus, (*Metamorphosis*), Dallas Women's Chorus (*Only Human*), New York City Gay Men's Chorus (*In This Heart of Mine*), Turtle Creek Chorale (*To a Dancing Star*), Gay Men's Chorus of Washington (*This House Shall Stand: Songs of My Family*), Seattle Men's Chorus (*Over the Skies of Yisrael*) and the Portland Gay Men's Chorus (*BraveSouls* & *Dreamers*). He currently serves as Artistic Director for Caballeros The Gay Men's Chorus of Palm Springs.

Librettist Robert Espindola

is a professional educator and a minister. He graduated with honors from Graceland College in Lamoni, Iowa in 1975. After completing graduate studies in psychology at Illinois State and San Francisco State University, he taught

in the California school system for twenty years. In 1992 he was honored as one of California's distinguished educators. A strong advocate for teenagers living with HIV/AIDS, he traveled extensively throughout the United States and Canada, conducting workshops and seminars. He has been the keynote speaker at two National AIDS conferences, and served in 1993 as a delegate to the International Conference on AIDS in Yokohama, Japan.

Soloists

Kris Anne Weiss has performed leading roles in many operas, including L'Italiana in Algeri, Le Nozze di Figaro, Cosi fan tutte, and Madama Butterfly. In 2010, she premiered the lead role in a new opera, The Ladysmith Story, by Chris Gable. KrisAnne teaches voice at the Mount Olivet School of Music and has taught at the University of Minnesota, Lawrence University, and Luther College.

A.P. Hopper began her involvement with choral music in fourth grade and has since continually participated in music ministry as a vocalist, accompanist, and director. She has been privileged to be the bass section leader and occasional soloist of One Voice Mixed Chorus for 7 years and assistant director for 3 years (2007-2010). A.P. and Cyndi, her wonderful and musically gifted spouse of 13 years, live in Coon Rapids where they enjoy hosting their five children and two grandchildren bi-weekly.

Emily Tinawi started singing when she was just a youngin'. She continued to sing throughout elementary, middle, and high school, as well throughout college at Oberlin College in Ohio. During her lifetime she has sung

with 3 professional choirs in the DC area and been involved with various professional theatre companies throughout the US. In 2004, Emily won the National Choral Award and still has the certificate hanging in her room. Since graduating Emily performed in several cabarets as well as was a featured soloist for the Second Unitarian's Sunday choir in Chicago, IL and since moving to Minnesota has felt lucky to have found Once Voice. This is Emily's 5th season with One Voice and has been privileged to be a part of two Spring Fever Cabarets. She is currently teaching fourth grade language arts at Achieve Language Academy in St. Paul, Minnesota.

Eric McCool, an Iowa native, graduated from Luther College where he sang under the direction of Mr. Weston Noble with the internationally acclaimed Nordic Choir. Eric received his J.D. from the Thomas M. Cooley Law School in Lansing, MI. While in law school Eric found his stress relief through song with the Michigan State Singers. Currently, Eric can be seen singing around the Twin Cities and with the guys of the Twin Cities Gay Men's Chorus and OutLoud under the direction of Dr. Stan Hill. Eric is an attorney with the State of Minnesota.

Artistic Staff

Jane Ramseyer Miller, Artistic Director

Jane is in her 17th year as Artistic Director with One Voice and also works as Artistic Director-in-Residence for GALA Choruses, Inc. She holds Masters of Music in Choral Conducting from the University of Minnesota and a B.A. in psychology from the University of Waterloo in Ontario, Canada. She especially enjoys creative community collaborations and has created choral music with 15-Head Theater Lab, The Women's Cancer Resource Center, Shakopee Women's Correctional Facility, Heart of the Beast, Kairos Dance Theatre, Mu Daiko, Teens Rock the Mic and District 202 among others. In 2008 Jane received the GALA Choruses Legacy Award for her conducting, innovative programming and commitment to community outreach. In 2010 she was awarded the ACDA VocalEssence Award for Creative Programming and the ACDA Minnesota Advocate for Choral Excellence (ACE) Award.

Scott Lykins, Accompanist

Scott recently joined the artistic team at One Voice as Accompanist. He began playing piano at age five in his native Brainerd, Minnesota, and studied privately for twelve years, gaining considerable experience in vocal and string collaboration. He holds Bachelors and Masters Degrees from the Eastman School of Music in Cello Performance and is a freelance artist around the Twin Cities. An advocate for the exploration of innovative music presentation, Scott is Founder and Artistic Director of the Lakes Area Music Festival in Brainerd, Minnesota and Managing Assistant for the inaugural season of the Minneapolis Mill City Summer Opera this summer, 2012.

Randi Grundahl Rexroth, OVation Ensemble Coach

Randi is delighted to be working with OVation and has enjoyed coaching this talented group of singers. She is also a choir director at the Visitation School in Mendota Heights, Assistant Director for the Twin Cities Women's Choir, and is music directing several shows in Hudson, Wisconsin, and at Macalester College. When she's not conducting, teaching, or directing, she's arranging and composing while trying to perform.
