from the Artistic Director

Rarely has a concert project so captured my heart and emotions. I began the research for **Unsilenced** nearly 18 months ago and have been deeply moved by the stories of resilient individuals who lived in the camps, those who risked their lives in the resistance movement, and the ways that music offered hope in a setting of complete hopelessness.

We have come a long way in our work for justice in the years since World War II, but we still have a long way to go. Supreme Court Justice Thurgood Marshall said:

"We cannot play ostrich. Democracy cannot flourish amid fear. Liberty cannot bloom amid hate. Justice cannot take root amid rage. We must dissent from indifference. We must dissent from apathy. We must dissent from the fear, the hatred and the mistrust. The legal system can force open doors and sometimes even knock down walls. But it cannot build bridges. That job belongs to you and me."

One Voice is known for its musical excellence, diverse repertoire, humor and strong commitment to community outreach. Its 90 singing members span ages 17 to 71, and its "Fifth Section" boasts more than 50 non-singing volunteers. One Voice is the largest GLBT mixed chorus in North America, and has performed for thousands of people in the Twin Cities, Greater Minnesota and beyond.

Jewish Voices of the Holocaust

Holocaust Cantata: Songs from the Camps

Arranged by Donald McCullough English lyrics and narration by Denny Clark

All of the songs in the Holocaust Cantata, originally in Polish, were found in the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum archives and were written by prisoners while incarcerated in Nazi concentration camps. The readings are based on interview transcripts and historical data.

Forgotten Heritage Reclaimed





As part of our **Unsilenced** concerts, One Voice commissioned Donald McCullough, composer of *Holocaust Cantata*, to write an additional movement and narrative text that addresses the experience of GLBT prisoners in the Holocaust. The commission is based on the song *Dicke Luft* by Aleksander Kulisiewiecz.

In addition to the music, One Voice's commission includes the spoken narratives that frame the music, written by Danny Clark. We acknowledge Doug Ireland for gracious permission to use his translation of the story of Pierre Seel, which first appeared on his website, http://direland.typepad.com/direland/.

Silenced No More. . .

The last Nazi concentration camp was liberated by the Allies on May 9, 1945. The 64 years since have not been easy for gays imprisoned in the Nazi era, and the treatment of homosexuals in concentration camps went unacknowledged by most countries. For the estimated 40 percent of gay prisoners who actually survived the camps, reparations and state pensions available to other groups were denied, as gay men were still classified as criminals. Survivors could be re-imprisoned for "repeat offences" and were kept on the ongoing lists of "sex offenders."

It is no surprise that many gay men imprisoned by the Nazis went underground and stories of their post war lives are largely unknown. In fact, Paragraph 175 was not repealed until 1994, just 15 years ago. In 2002 the German government issued an official apology for Nazi atrocities to the gay community.



The Pink Triangle

Nazi officials developed a system of marking each inmate with color-coded triangles signifying the reason for detention: green for criminals, red for political prisoners, black for "asocials" such as gypsies and lesbians, yellow for Jews. Homosexual male prisoners were forced to wear a pink triangle sewn to their uniform jackets. In the 1970's, GLBT liberation groups reclaimed the pink triangle as a symbol for the gay rights movement.

Today

The Canadian Parliament of the "Coalition to Combat Antisemitism" was recently established in response to a growing sentiment that "Antisemitism is on the rise around the world on a scale not seen since World War II" (per coalition- and Parliament-member Joyce Murray).

GLBT individuals still struggle for basic rights and protection in this country, including freedom from violence and harassment, an end to workplace and housing discrimination, access to legal marriage rights, and the granting of medical (especially end-of-life) decision-making to same-sex partners. A report released just last month by the Coalition of Anti-Violence Programs reveals that anti-GLBT violence has risen to its highest level in ten years—a 28 percent increase from 2007.

Findings by the 2007 National School Climate Survey revealed that 87 percent of GLBT students in Minnesota were verbally harassed in the past year due to their sexual orientation or gender expression, with 14 percent reporting being physically assaulted.

Guest Artists





Janet Horvath

Canada native Janet Horvath joined the Minnesota Orchestra in 1980 as associate principal cello. Among her many appearances as a soloist and chamber musician, she has performed *Kol Nidre* for the Jewish Holy Night of Yom Kippur, or Day of Atonement, annually for more than 20 years; first at Mount Zion Temple St Paul and currently at Temple Israel in Minneapolis. She has also performed the work as soloist with the Minnesota Orchestra at the Basilica of Saint Mary in 2005 and at Orchestra Hall in 2008. Other recent solo engagements with the Orchestra include Stephen Paulus' *Concerto for String Quartet and Orchestra* and Paul Schoenfield's *Café Music.* In May 2009 she performed Rayel's *Trio for Piano, Violin and Cello* as part of the

Orchestra's Chamber Music at MacPhail series, and in May 2010 she will play Bloch's *First Piano Quintet* on the same series. Horvath is a pioneer and recognized authority in the area of medical problems of performing artists. A recipient of the Richard J. Lederman Lecture Award presented by the Performing Arts Medicine Association, she founded the acclaimed "Playing (Less) Hurt" conference series. She has published numerous articles in professional journals and is the author of *Playing (less) Hurt—an Injury Prevention Guide for Musicians*, which was released in 2002. The 2009 edition of the book just won the gold medal in the health category at the Independent Publishers' 2009 Book Awards. She is currently preparing a book on music in the Holocaust, particularly emphasizing how the arts can be used as a bridge to greater understanding between cultures, as the next generation—the living witnesses—go forward.
